



119th Street under U.S. 69 Highway will close overnight Nov. 22 and 24

In Overland Park, eastbound and westbound 119th Street under U.S. 69 will be **fully closed** to traffic from 7 p.m. Friday, Nov. 22 to 10 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 23. The road also will be **fully closed** from 5 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 24 to 6 a.m. Monday, Nov. 25.

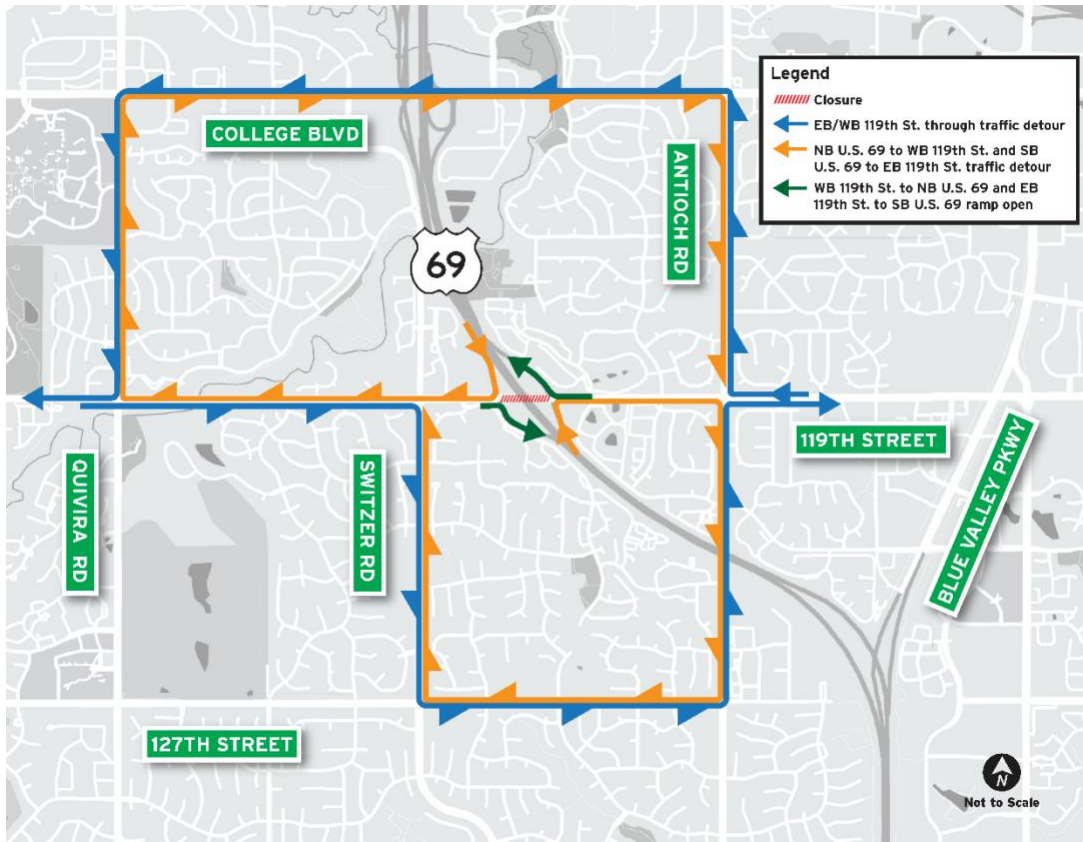
Ramps will remain open for right-turn off and on movements. The Highland Plaza shopping center will remain open and accessible from the west during the 119th Street closure period.

During the closures, detours will be marked as follows:

- **Eastbound 119th Street traffic will detour south on Switzer Road, then east on 127th Street to Antioch Road, then north to 119th Street.**
- **Westbound 119th Street traffic will detour north along Antioch Road, then west on College Boulevard to Quivira Road, then south to 119th Street.**
- **Traffic exiting southbound U.S. 69 to 119th Street and desiring to travel east on 119th Street will turn right onto 119th Street, then detour north on Quivira Road, then east on College Boulevard to Antioch Road, then south to 119th Street.**
- **Traffic exiting northbound U.S. 69 to 119th Street and desiring to travel west on 119th Street will turn right onto 119th Street, then detour south on Antioch Road, then west on 127th Street to Switzer Road, then north to 119th Street.**

The overnight closures are necessary for girder setting on the U.S. 69 bridge over 119th Street. The work is part of the KDOT U.S. 69 Expansion Project (69Express). All scheduled project work is weather permitting and subject to change.

Map below shows closure location marked in red and U.S. 69/119th Street detour routes marked in blue, orange and green.



The 69Express project includes reconstruction of U.S. 69, widening the highway with added express lanes – one in each direction between 151st and 103rd Streets – and interchange improvements at U.S. 69/167th Street in Overland Park.
