## **Northbound and southbound U.S. 69 segment will be closed overnight next week in Overland Park**

All northbound and southbound U.S. 69 lanes between 103rd Street and College Boulevard will be fully closed to traffic overnight next week in Johnson County.

This highway segment will be closed during the following times:

- 7 p.m. Tuesday, May 27 to 6 a.m. Wednesday, May 28
- 7 p.m. Wednesday, May 28 to 6 a.m. Thursday, May 29

These closures are necessary for pavement work and overhead truss installation, part of the KDOT U.S. 69 Corridor Modernization and Expansion Project (69Express). All scheduled project work is weather permitting and subject to change.

During the closure, detours will be marked as follows:

**Northbound U.S. 69:** Motorists will be directed to use the eastbound I-435 ramp, then travel east to exit at Antioch Road. Turn left on Antioch Road, then travel north and turn left to use the westbound I-435 entrance ramp. Travel west on I-435 and use the northbound U.S. 69 ramp.

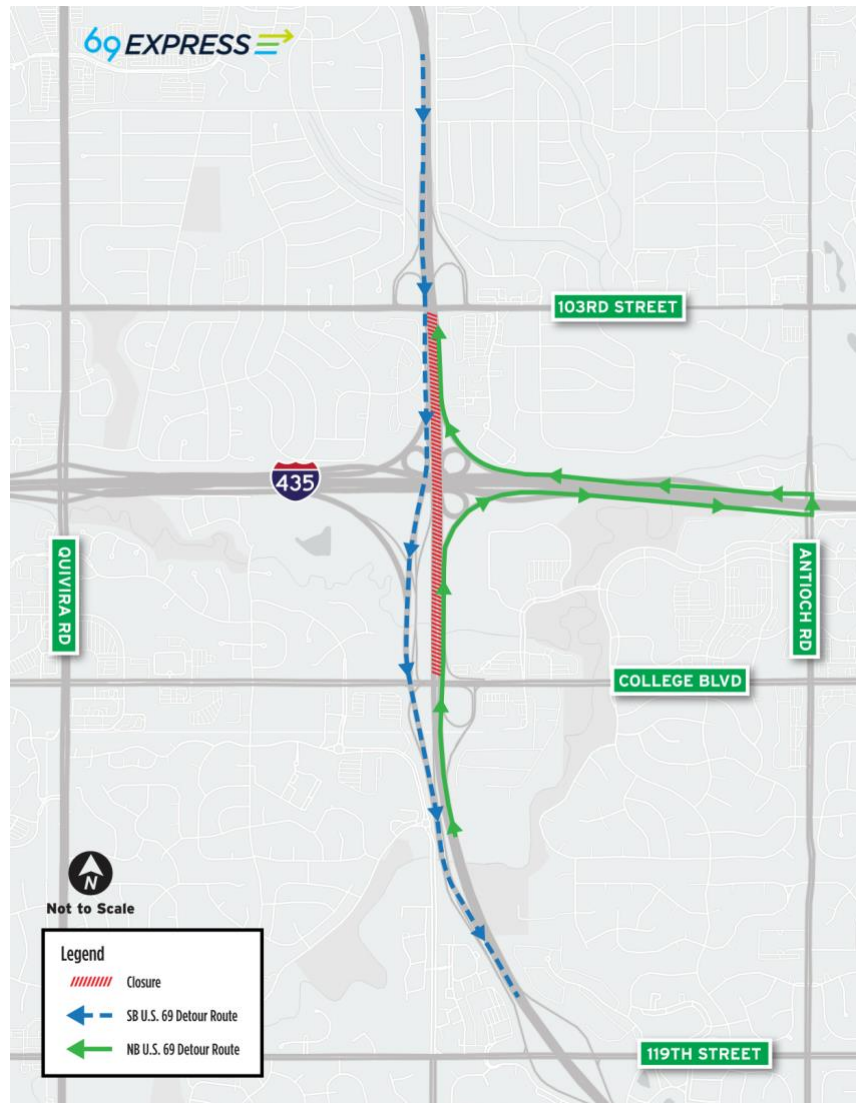
**Southbound U.S. 69:** Motorists will be directed to use the I-435/103rd Street ramp, then continue south to enter southbound U.S. 69.

The 69Express project includes reconstruction of U.S. 69, widening the highway with added express lanes – one in each direction between 151<sup>st</sup> and 103<sup>rd</sup> Streets – and interchange improvements at U.S. 69/167<sup>th</sup> Street in Overland Park.
