

Express lanes reduce congestion and improve travel times by allowing drivers the option to pay a toll to drive in the free-flowing express lanes. This has the added benefit of also reducing congestion in the toll-free, general-purpose lanes.

How the Express Lanes Work

U.S. 69 from 151st Street to 103rd Street in Overland Park, Kansas, is being widened from four to six lanes (three lanes in each direction). The new lanes (also called express lanes) will be tolled to provide additional long-term safety, traffic flow and travel time reliability benefits. The existing general-purpose lanes will remain free.

Drivers can enter and exit the express lanes on U.S. 69 at two points along the 6-mile corridor.

- Each express lane will be separated from the general-purpose lanes with a buffer and wide double white lines.
- Northbound and southbound traffic will be separated by a concrete barrier.
- Trips will be identified using both license plate readers and KTAGs or compatible transponder.
- There will be no toll booths.

Pricing

- Toll pricing is variable and changes based on time of day and traffic congestion.
- The price shown on the overhead signs at the point of entry is the KTAG, or compatible transponder, price for using the express lane.

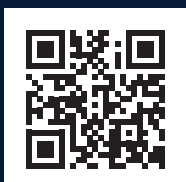
Payment Options

KTAG

Drivers with a KTAG, or compatible transponder, pay tolls automatically and save 50%.

Without a KTAG

Drivers without a compatible transponder, like KTAG, will receive a mailed statement from DriveKS. Tolls can be paid by visiting the DriveKS.com website, by phone or by mail.
